Designer Note: Years ago, one of my students described the straw bobbin technique and I've used it ever since. It is possible to get an immense quantity of yarn on a straw - know that every time you add another length of yarn there are two ends to be dealt with!

You may wish to try winding drinking straw bobbins that hold a larger quantity of yarn. To make, cut a plastic straw in half. Tape the yarn end to the center of the straw and wrap yarn around the straw in a **figure 8**. (*Illustration 1*) When you feel the bobbin is as full as you desire, cut yarn and run through the center of the straw.

Cable Stitch

Row 4: *P1, C4F (sl2 sts to cn and hold in front, k2, k2 from cn); rep from * across row, end p1.

Stitch Patterns:
